Welcoming A New Baby

- **NIR New patient nominations**

- **As notified by the midwife from mothers' intention**
- **In study - TKA&M – 78%**



- **Attends practice before for other health issues**



- **Walk in's / family connection**

- **In study these two groups = 22%**

NIR notification – via Provider Inbox

A decision needs to be made one way or other and NIR notified – weekly/daily

- **Accepting** – this is the norm if patient or family are enrolled patients
- **Rejecting** – if baby or family unknown

 **Preliminary Newborn (B)** Complete eligibility and enrolment process

- **After enrolling under the 'B' code, the practice will receive First Level Health Subsidy for the new born for 3 months = no clawback**



- **To maintain ongoing funding, the caregiver needs to enrol**



- **Once the baby has been registered and enrolled under the 'B' code, a flurry of activity needs to occur**

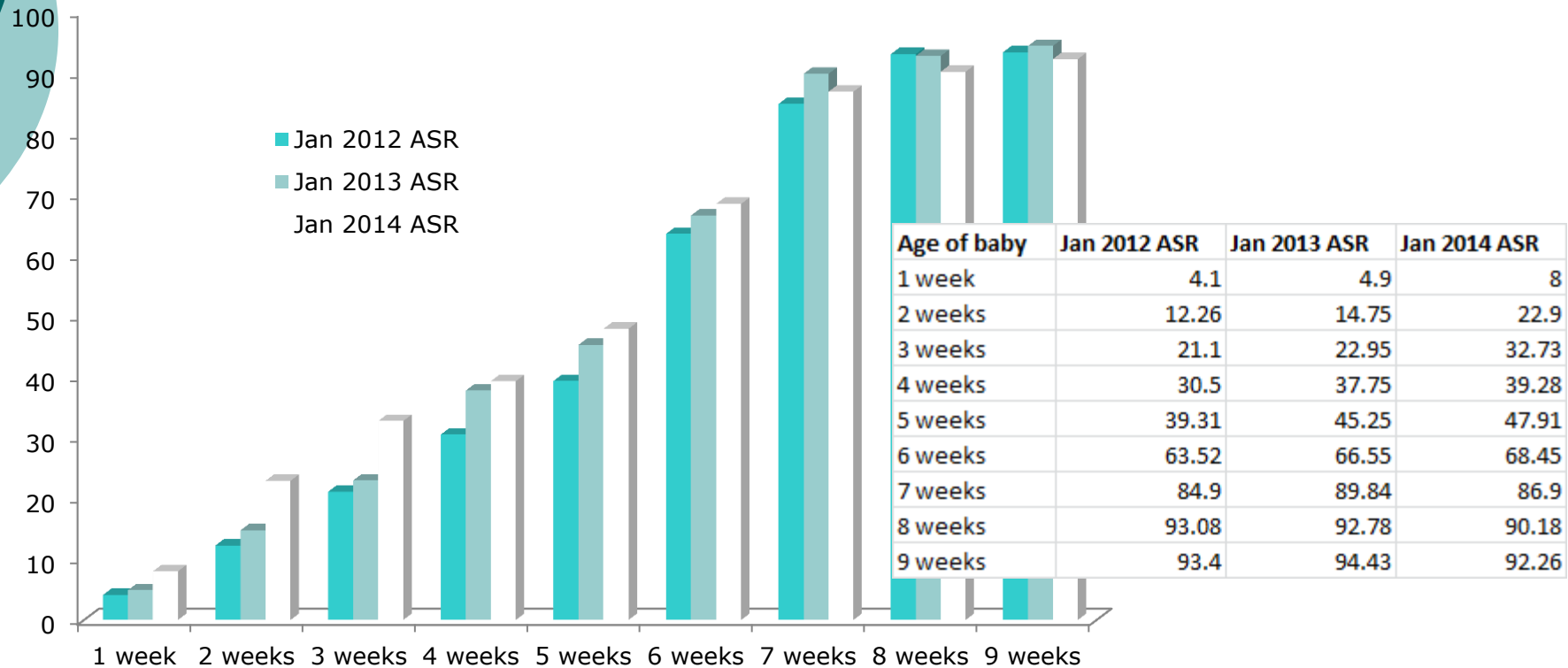

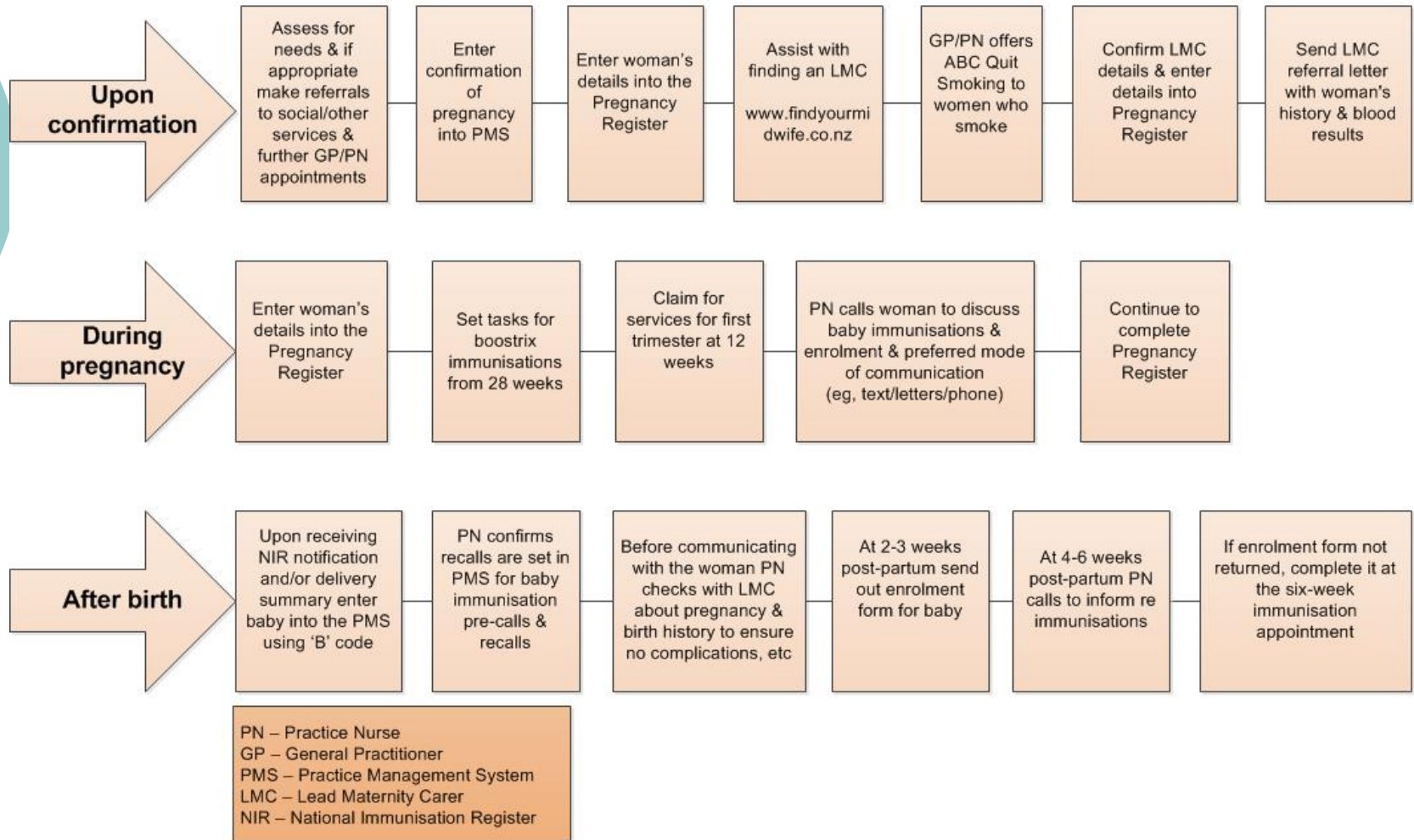
- This resource provides general practice with practical suggestions to support the process of ensuring newborns are enrolled with general practice as close to birth as possible and no later than **two weeks after birth.**
- It is important that newborns are enrolled close to birth to ensure childhood immunisations are given on time and to maximise the child's health as they grow. Furthermore early enrolment ensures that newborns have access to affordable and essential health care sooner.

The MOH Advocates:



- **Policy and process development**
- **Person in practice to be responsible for health needs of pregnant women and newborns**
- **Practice Pregnancy Register**

Pregnancy confirmed at general practice



Practice Pregnancy Register

- **Woman**

- ● Name
- ● Age
- ● Address
 - Phone number
 - Estimated date of delivery
 - Name and phone number of the LMC
 - Smoking status
 - Pertussis vaccine given
 - Influenza vaccine given



- **Baby**

- Date of birth
- Whether the baby is exposed to smokers in the house
- Breastfeeding status (exclusive, fully, partial, artificial).

What happens now?

You can make an appointment with your GP to discuss your pregnancy

The practice can help you find a Lead Maternity Carer (LMC) website, www.findyourmidwife.co.nz)

Your GP can arrange pregnancy screening and blood tests

You need to contact an LMC and arrange a first appointment

Book in to antenatal classes

During pregnancy

You will see your LMC for your pregnancy care. Come and see your GP if you are otherwise unwell

You can get immunised against the flu at any time during pregnancy and against whooping cough at any time after 28 weeks. Discuss this with your LMC. The practice nurse at your general practice can give you these immunisations

After birth

It's important that your baby is enrolled with a general practice for any health care needs. Your GP will be notified of your baby's birth and the practice will send you enrolment forms which you need to fill out and return to your practice

At between 4 and 5 weeks after the birth your GP or practice nurse will contact you to make an appointment for your baby's six-week immunisations

You will need to complete your baby's enrolment form and return to your GP before or when you take your baby to the six-week immunisation

When your baby is six weeks old, you will need to take him or her to their general practice to get the six-week immunisations

If you have any concerns please do not hesitate to call your LMC or practice nurse

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- **If best practice is applied, the immunisation statistics will take care of themselves, more people will be immunised and the burden of vaccine preventable diseases will be reduced**
