Post Natal Screening Programme

Purpose	The purpose of the Post Natal Screening Programme (previously <i>Healthy Māmā Healthy Pēpī</i>) is to provide a funded post-natal consultation for a new māmā at the same time as their newborn pēpī receives their 6-week immunisations and Health Check.			
Introduction	The <i>Post Natal Screening</i> programme is funded by Auckland PHO. It is a maternal six- week postnatal check and provides an opportunity to review a woman's physical and mental health, the events of her pregnancy and birth, as well as lactation and contraception options.			
	The <i>Post Natal Screening</i> programme addresses the need for early engagement between the whānau/family of the newborn baby and the GP team, ensuring the 6 week (and beyond) immunisation event is carried out on time, and the re-establishment of the relationship between the new mother and the GP team for the ongoing benefit of the mother and child.			
	Be aware of the Best Start 6 Week Pēpī initiative - found here, that provides additional guidance and support for māmā and pēpē.			
Pro Equity Approach	It is important to ensure whānau Māori are prioritised as well as Pasifika and whānau living in Quintile 5 when delivering the <i>Post Natal Screening</i> programme. This may include several attempts to contact the mama to encourage a visit to the practice. Māori consumer experiences of health services and programmes are an important informer of variables that impact health inequity, therefore a positive encounter, particularly at the 6-week immunisation event and postnatal consultation increases the likelihood of successive return visits for immunisations and Primary Care consultations. https://equityhealthj.biomedcentral.com/articles/10.1186/s12939-019-1057-4
